| CHANGES to the 2004-05 Calendar | |
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| Page 13 | - The B.Ed. program has limited space and admission is competitive. Admission decisions will be released on two dates: March 31, 2004 , and May 15, 2004 . |
| Page 19 | - Under Memorandum of Agreement with Taylor University College students are no longer required to receive an advisor's permission to take a course at another institution. The Registry Officer will approve requests. |
| Page 22 | - Under Faculty Advisors a faculty advisor's signature is no longer required to make registration changes. |
| Page 23 | - Under Returning Students students wishing to make subsequent changes to their registration are no longer required to see their advisor and obtain his or her signature on an add/drop form. |
| Page 23 | - Under Add/Drop Procedure students are no longer required to have their advisor's signature on an add/drop form. |
| Page 24 | International Student Health Insurance: International students are required to have health insurance. Students will be charged \$642. ⁰⁰ for 12 months of insurance (students starting in September) or \$428. ⁰⁰ for 8 months of insurance (students starting in January). Students may opt out of this insurance and have the charges reversed if proof of other medical insurance is provided. See the Student Life Office for more details. |
| Page 25 | - Under Residential Costs 'Cooking appliances such as toasters and microwave ovens are not permitted in " The Tower ". |
| Page 25 | - ' Returning residence students in "The Tower" only will receive a \$200.00 discount on annual occupancy costs. ' |
| Page 41 | - Food Services – Cafeteria - Those housed in "The Tower" must purchase one of three food services plans. See page 25 for occupancy and food costs. |
| Page 51 | - Under Graduation the application to graduate no longer requires the advisor's signature or the division chairperson's signature. |
| Page 56 | - Under Taking a Course at Another Institution the advisor's and division chairperson's signatures are no longer required. All such courses must be approved by the Registry Officer in advance. |
