Guidelines for Directed Study Courses

Directed study courses are those usually numbered 499. The purpose of these courses is to allow advanced students to further their study in a specific area of interest that is not addressed in scheduled course offerings or the periodic special topics courses. The courses will have the same if not more rigorous requirements as standard classroom courses. Students must have completed two senior-level courses in the discipline in which they are requesting directed study, must have demonstrated the ability to do independent research and writing, and must normally be full-time students. Directed Study courses are available at the discretion of the faculty member.

Students desiring to do a directed study course must complete a Directed Studies Application, which is available through the Registry. Applications for directed study courses must normally be made to the proposed faculty supervisor 45 days prior to the commencement of the term in which the directed study course is desired. Students are advised to begin this process prior to the conclusion of the Winter term if the course is to occur in the Fall. The faculty supervisor and the student must together create a Directed Studies Syllabus. The Application must be signed by the faculty supervisor and the Division Chair. It, accompanied by the Directed Studies Syllabus, must be presented to the Registry to register in a directed study course.

New Course:

PHED 222 – Strength Training and Conditioning

2008-09, Fall 1.5(0-0-3)

This course is intended as an introduction to the basic principles of strength training and cardiovascular conditioning. Emphasis is placed on fitness testing and evaluation, training techniques, program design, methods of training and implementation.
