### NEW COURSES for 1999-2000

**CMPT 225** *Personal Computer Administration* 1999-2000, Winter 0.75(1-0-2) This course is designed to take students who have basic computer literacy and allow them to explore, in more detail, the functioning of personal computer hardware and operating systems. Topics covered include: basic physical configuration of a personal computer, the addition of RAM, installation of drives and expansion cards, the installation and configuration of Windows 95, external connections via network and modem, and the Windows 95 user interface. This course is taught as a six week module.  
*Prerequisite: CMPT 210*

PHIL/SOCI 399 *An Introduction to the Philosophy of Nietzsche* 1999-2000, Fall 3(3-0-0) This course will introduce students to the major themes of Friedrich Nietzsche's (1844-1900) philosophy. We will focus on an examination of Nietzsche's discussion of the causes and consequences of Western Nihilism, in addition to the solutions he proposes for its overcoming (the Overman and Eternal Recurrence).

*Prerequisite: PHIL 230 or SOCI 200*

SOCI 347 *Film and Contemporary Culture* 1999-2000, Winter 3(3-2-0) Beginning with the assumption that films function as sophisticated and significant "texts" that inform us about our society and culture, we will attempt to measure the current "temper of the times" through cinematic eyes. The course will critically examine the defining themes of postmodern culture (e.g., enchantment with technology, hyperreality, spiritual yearning, individualism, alienation, and pluralism) with a focus on a number of "popular" films.

*Prerequisites: SOCI 200*

GREK 205 *Elementary Greek* 1999-2000, Fall and Winter 6(3-0-2) This course is an introduction to classical Greek with emphasis on grammar and on building basic vocabulary. It includes the reading of simple texts and, in the second term, the reading of Xenophon's *Anabasis*.

**Note that this is a full year course and it will be cancelled if 10 students are not registered within the week before classes begin.**
