New Courses

CMPT 499 Every Year 3(0-3-0) – **Directed Studies in Computing Science**

An opportunity to do advanced study of a special topic of particular interest to a student. Students work with a member of the computing science faculty. Students must apply in advance to a member of the computing science faculty.

Prerequisites: Six credits in computing science at the 300-level and consent of instructor

PHIL 399 2003-04, Fall 3(3-0-0) – **Special Topics in Philosophy – An Introduction to the Philosophy of Nietzsche**

This course will introduce students to the major themes of Friedrich Nietzsche's (1844-1900) philosophy. We will focus on an examination of Nietzsche's discussion of the causes and consequences of Western Nihilism, in addition to the solutions he proposes for its overcoming (the Overman and Eternal Recurrence).

Prerequisites: PHIL 230

PSYC 494 2003-04, Winter 3(3-0-0) – **Introduction to Sport and Exercise Psychology**

This course will provide an introduction to the concepts, themes and modern theories involved with the study of Sport and Exercise Psychology. Additionally, the practical application of select contemporary research in Sport and Exercise Psychology will be explored.

Prerequisites: PSYC 250 or 251, and 305

SOCI 318 2003-04, Fall 3(3-0-0) – **Multicultural and Aboriginal Relations in Canada**

Canada encompasses a wide diversity of cultures and ethnic groups. It is often described as having two founding nations even though Aboriginal peoples predated the settling of the French and the English and are a vibrant element in Canadian society. Numerous ethnic groups have also become part of what is often termed "the Canadian mosaic". In this course we will examine these issues from a variety of sociological perspectives.

Prerequisites: Three credits in sociology at the introductory level
